- The queens and kings are everyone who is not in that act.
- Stage picture/tableaux is key: use levels, triangulate, pick gestures.

Act 1: A Midsummer Night's Dream

ALL DREAMERS:

Your royal majesties, Queen Elizabeth and King James, would you care to hear a play?

Queens & Kings:

I'd be delighted Master Shakespeare, what is it called?

ALL DREAMERS:

"A magical comedy, A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM!"

- 1. If we shadows have offended
- 2. Think but this and all is mended
- 3. That you have but slumbered here
- 4. While these visions did appear
- 5. And this weak and idle theme
- 6. No more yielding but a dream...

ALL DREAMERS:

"A Midsummer Night's Dream!"

Act 2: *Macbeth*

ALL MACBETHS:

Your royal majesties, Queen Elizabeth and King James, would you care to hear another play?

Queens & Kings:

I'd be delighted Master Shakespeare, what is it called?

ALL MACBETHS:

"A Scottish tragedy, MACBETH!"

- 1. Is this a dagger which I see before me?
- 2. The handle toward my hand? Come, let me clutch thee!
- 3. I have thee not, and yet I see thee still.
- 4. I go and it is done, the bell invites me.
- 5. Hear it not Duncan, for it is a knell...
- 6. That summons thee to heaven or to hell!

ALL MACBETHS:

"Macbeth!"

Act 3: Julius Caesar

ALL CAESARS:

Your royal majesties, Queen Elizabeth and King James, would you care to hear another play?

Queens & Kings:

I'd be delighted Master Shakespeare, what is it called?

ALL CAESARS:

"A Roman History, JULIUS CAESAR!"

- 1. Friends, Romans, Countrymen, lend me your ears!
- 2. Here, come I to speak in Caesar's funeral...
- 3. He was my friend, faithful and just to me.
- 4. You all did love him once, not without cause.
- 5. O judgment! Thou art fled to brutish beasts
- 6. And men have lost their reason.

ALL CAESARS:

"Julius Caesar!"

Act 4: Hamlet

ALL HAMLETS:

Your royal majesties, Queen Elizabeth and King James, would you care to hear ONE MORE play?

Queens & Kings:

I'd be delighted Master Shakespeare, what is it called?

ALL HAMLETS:

"A major tragedy, HAMLET!"

- 1. To be or not to be, that is the question.
- 2. Whether tis' nobler in the mind to suffer
- 3. the slings and arrows of outrageous fortune,
- 4. Or to take arms against a sea of troubles
- 5. And by opposing, end them.

ALL HAMLETS:

"Hamlet!" (then freeze)

*One actor says: "Will all the other actors join us on the boards?"

Act 5: *Epilogue*

All actors join them on stage, create a tableaux, wait for Kitty's cue...then:

"Shakespeare lives in us all...HUZZAH!"
